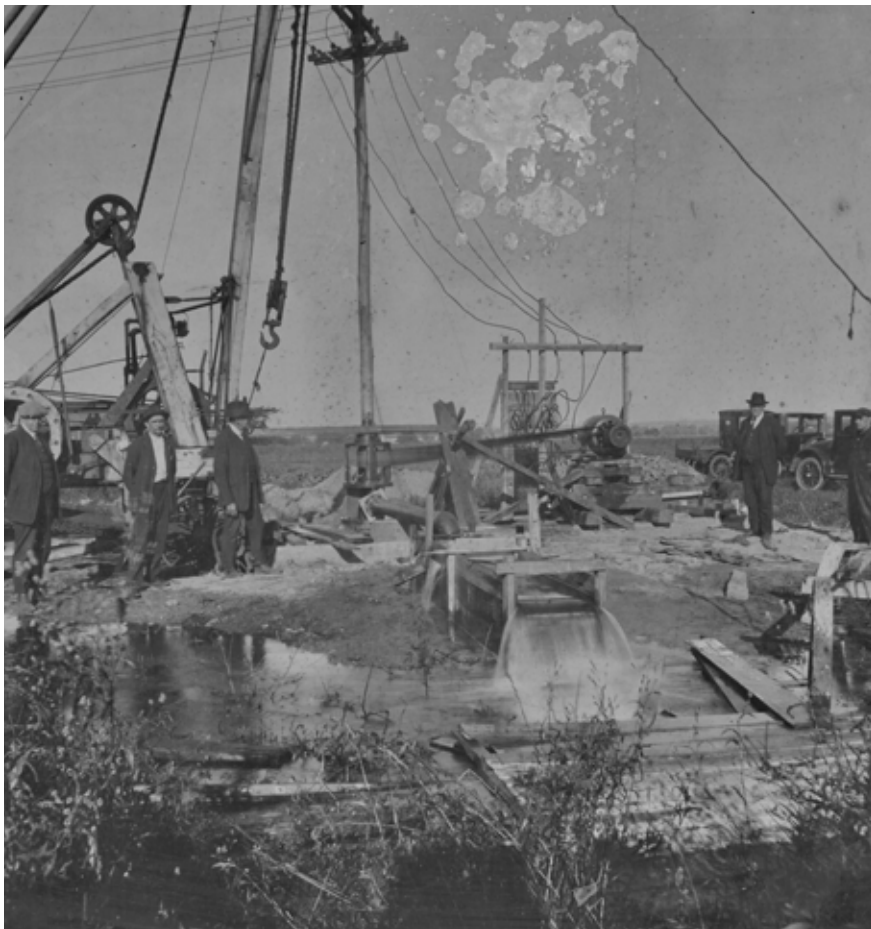

1921-2021



In 1902, the Oyster Bay Town Board granted a franchise to the privately owned Nassau Water Company to establish a water works company. It was located on a small triangle of land located just west of Broadway, between Old Country Road and West Carl Street. The Nassau Water Company served the district for almost 20 years, but the residents of Hicksville felt the utility was being mismanaged and complained about the service. Those complaints were justified as the water mains were badly rusted, causing clothes and cooking utensils to become stained. Frustrated by the company's inability to provide adequate service, 700 of the 4,500 local residents got together and petitioned the Oyster Bay Town Board in support of forming their own "Hicksville" Water District. The measure was passed on August 30, 1921.

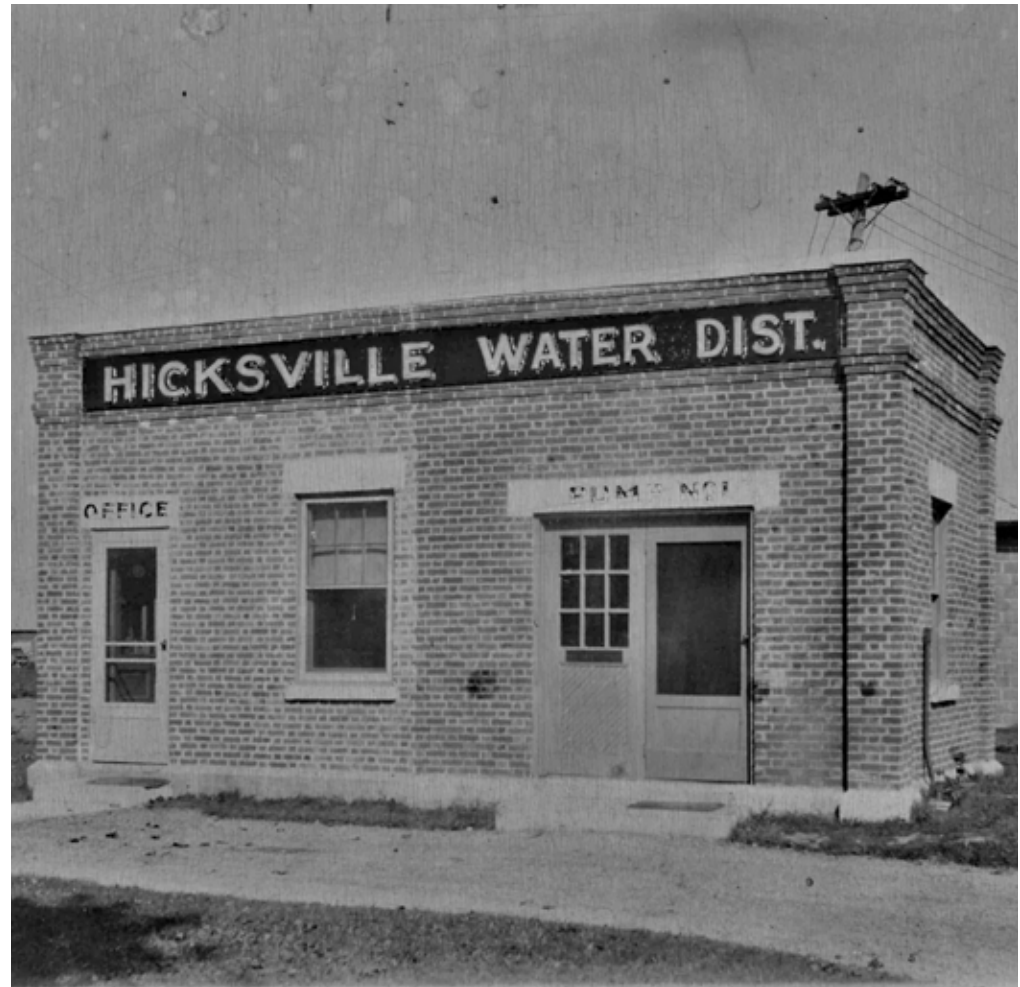

During that August 30, 1921 meeting, Ernest Franke, William I. Magill and August P. Deppisch were elected as the first water Commissioners of the new water district.

They held their first meeting at an office in the Nassau Lumber Company on September 2, 1921. In the summer of 1923, almost 5 acres near the railroad tracks on Bethpage Road were purchased from George Blyman for the price of \$6,000. The Karlson & Lee Company was then hired to dig two 150-foot wells and build the district's first administration building. Soon, the new wells were producing 2 million gallons of water a year, traveling through 17 miles of new pipelines. Pictured here are the Commissioners as well as the first office.

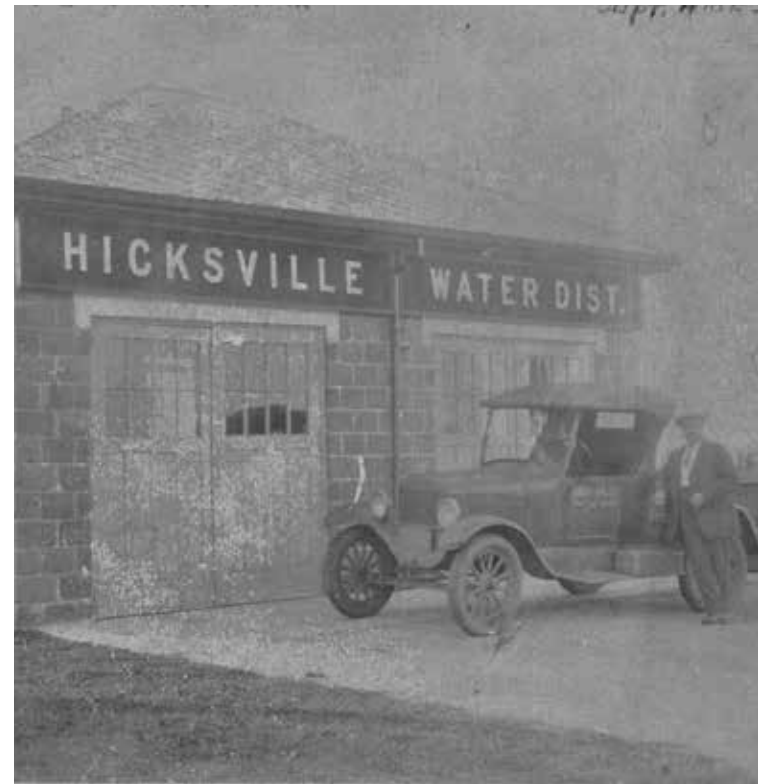

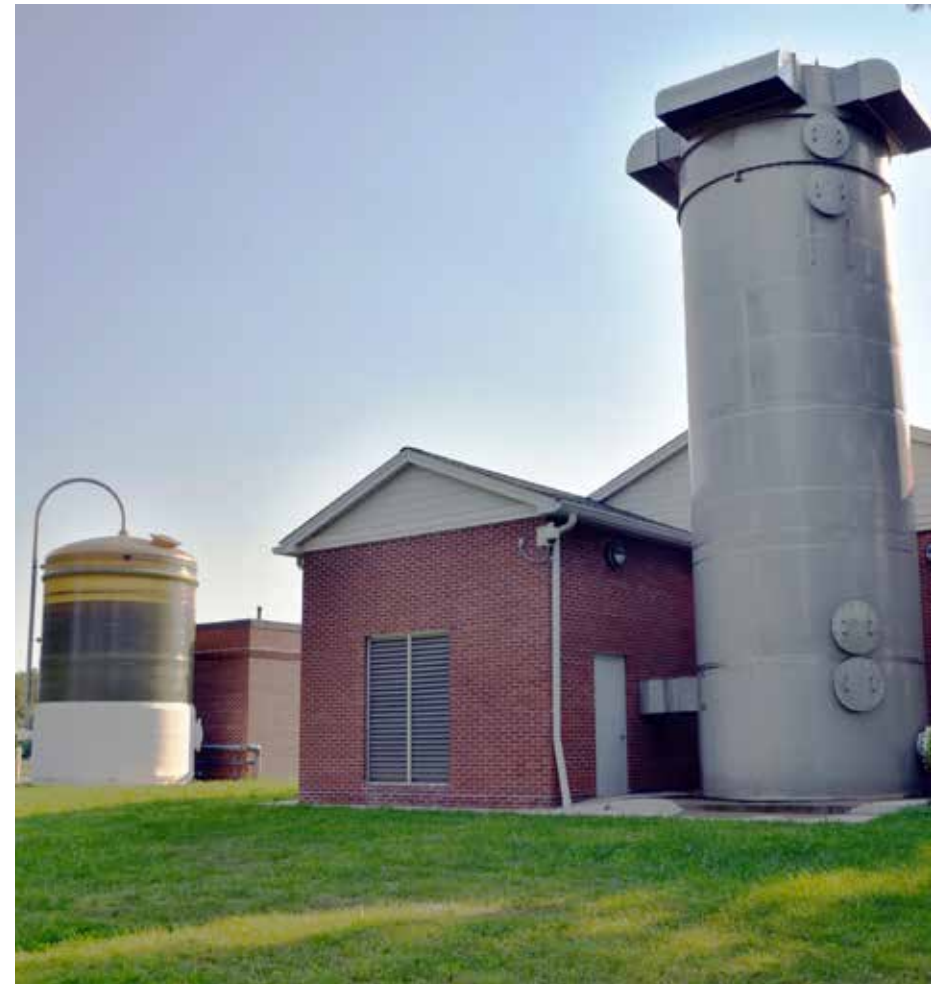

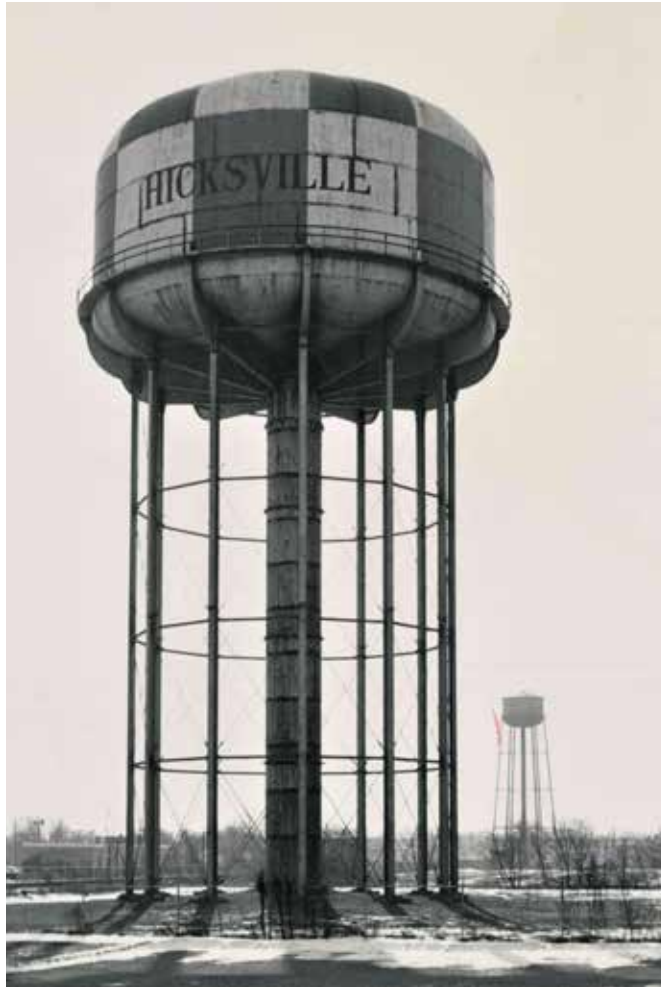

Water production plants are extremely important in ensuring your water remains safe. They house all of the necessary treatment systems which constantly test water samples as well as rid it from any contaminants. Recently, the Hickville Water District has been installing advanced oxidation process (AOP) and granular activated carbon (GAC) systems, in order to completely rid the water supply of 1,4-dioxane, perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA), perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS), and other emerging contaminants.

Nassau Sprinkling Regulations

- Use of water for irrigation purposes for lawns, shrubs, trees, plants and vegetation of any type is regulated by Nassau County.
- Absolutely No Watering Is Allowed Between 10 AM AND 4 PM.
- Sprinkling is permitted all other hours under the following guidelines:
 - Residents With Even House Numbers And Those Without Numbered Addresses May Water On Even Dates.
 - Residents With Odd House Numbers May Water On Odd Dates.
- These rules apply to automatic, time-controlled sprinkler systems as well as manually-operated hose sprinkling.

Water Conservation Tips

- Fix leaky faucets and plumbing joints will saves 20 gallons per day for every leak stopped
- Don't run the hose while washing your car and it will save 150 gallons
- Install water-saving shower heads and save 500 to 800 gallons per month
- Run only full loads in the washing machine and dishwasher and it will save 300 to 800 gallons per month
- Shorten your showers. Even a one or two minute reduction can save up to 700 gallons per month
- Use a broom instead of a hose to clean driveways and sidewalks and save 150 gallons or more each time
- Don't water the sidewalks, driveway or gutter. Adjust your sprinklers so that water lands on your lawn or garden where it belongs—and only there. Saves 500 gallons per month

Backflow Testing Requirements

New York State law mandates the installation of backflow devices on all appliances attached to the public water system like underground irrigation systems, swimming pools, dark rooms and solar heating systems. The devices must be tested annually by a certified tester and the results filed with the Hicksville Water District.

Water Meter Reading Made Easy

As part of the Hicksville Water District's continued commitment to servicing each of its residents, the District is in the process of installing new, digital water meters in each of our homes and residences. These new, digital readers will connect with the online app, EyeOnWater®, through which, residents can monitor their water usage, establish leak alerts to warn of potential issues and increase their potential to save money on water bills.
